



Process for appointment to ABC - Rural District Advisory Council Local Government and Local Governance Reform

Date to Publish Appointment: March 21, 2023 Date to Return Application: March 31, 2023

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENT

To qualify as a candidate for appointment as a rural district advisory councillor (RDAC), persons must reside within the applicable rural district and be <u>eligible to vote</u> under Section 13 of the *Municipal Elections Act*. To determine if your address is within the rural district, consult the <u>Elections NB street key search</u> tool.

The following persons are not qualified to be candidates in an election for an RDAC or to hold office as a member of an RDAC, therefore, they are not eligible to participate in this appointment process:

- a) a judge of The Court of Appeal of New Brunswick;
- b) a judge of The Court of King's Bench of New Brunswick;
- c) a judge of the Provincial Court;
- d) an employee in the Local Government and Local Governance Reform Division of the Department of Environment and Local Government; and
- e) an election officer for the election.

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Background:

- **1. Mandate:** Rural District Advisory Council members are elected to advise the Minister of Local Government and Local Governance Reform on local matters. The Minister retains authority for decision-making in rural districts, however, the advisory council members play an important advisory role to the Minister.
- **2. Composition** / **Terms**: The *Local Governance Act* provides the authority for the creation of RDACs. There are 12 rural districts. Three to six advisory members will form the advisory council. The number of advisory council members depends on the population in each rural district.

Residents will elect advisory members during the municipal election to represent wards, members-at-large or both. If there are remaining positions or vacancies -in a rural district following the nomination period or throughout the term, the Minister of Local Government and Local Governance Reform has the authority under subsection 176.21 of the *Local Governance Act* (vacancies on rural district advisory councils) to appoint the appropriate number of positions required to fill the composition of the rural district advisory council based on the process outlined in this document.

- **3.** Due to a resignation on February 23, 2023 in the Restigouche rural district, the following rural district advisory council position is vacant:
 - Restigouche rural district (Ward 2 one position)
- **4. Process:** Following the resignation on February 23, 2023, an advertisement will be posted to the <u>Local Governance Reform</u> website and will be distributed electronically to the remaining rural district advisory council members regarding the appointment process. The deadline for submissions is the end of business day on Friday, March 31, 2023. Application forms will be available online through the <u>Local Governance Reform</u> website or at the Office of the Restigouche Regional Service Commission, 68A Water Street, Campbellton, NB, (506) 789-2595.

Staff will facilitate the sharing of information and can scan and send documents on behalf of qualified candidates if computer access is not available.

Nominations will be submitted to <u>ELGNomination@gnb.ca</u>. All candidates will be contacted.
